Q725. The Federal budget - including both defense and non-defense programs - is facing across-the-board cuts of approximately 10% in January 2013, including over \$500 billion to Defense, if lawmakers fail to enact a plan before then to reduce the national debt by \$1.2 trillion. These budget cuts are referred to as "sequestration".
